

Thank you for your purchase of the SHARP LCD colour TV product. To ensure safety and many years of trouble-free operation of your product, please read the Important Safety Precautions carefully before using this product.

Important Safety Precautions

- Stand base must be attached to prevent the TV set from falling down and cause injuries.
- Cleaning Unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet before cleaning the product. Use a soft damp cloth to clean the product. Do not use liquid cleaners, aerosol cleaners or chemical cloth to clean it, as such materials may damage the product.
- Water and moisture Do not use the product near water, such as bathtub, washbasin, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool and in a wet basement.
- Do not place vases or any other water-filled containers on this product. The water may spill onto the product causing fire or electric shock.
- Stand Do not place the product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod or table. Doing so can cause the product to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. Use only a cart, stand, tripod, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the product. When mounting the product on a wall, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. Use only the mounting hardware recommended by the manufacturer.


Attaching the stand

- Before attaching (or detaching) the stand, unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet.
- Before performing work spread cushioning over the base area to lay the TV on. This will prevent it from being damaged.
- 1 Confirm the screws supplied with the TV.

Screws (×4) (used in step 3)

- 2 Insert the stand base guide pins to the stand holes on the rear of the TV. ((1)) Make sure the symbol on the stand base is parallel with the triangle symbol located at the back of the TV.
- 3 Insert and tighten the 4 screws into the 4 holes on the rear of the stand base. (2)


- To detach the stand, perform the steps in reverse order.
- The TV position setting is set to 7° backward after attaching the stand.
- Do not remove the plastic wrap before attaching the stand base to protect it from scratches.
- The bottom area of the set (curvy area) must be beyond the table's edge to prevent the TV from damage.

Connecting external devices


You can connect many types of external equipment to your TV, like a VCR, game console, camcorder, DVD player, Digital TV STB (Set Top Box) and PC. To view external source images, select the input source from **INPUT** on the remote control unit or **INPUT** on the TV.

- To protect all equipment, always turn off the TV before connecting to a VCR, game console, camcorder, DVD player, Digital TV STB (Set Top Box) PC or other external equipment
- Refer to the relevant operation manual (VCR, DVD player, etc.) carefully before making connections.



Initial auto installation

When the TV powers on for the first time after purchase, the initial auto installation wizard appears. Follow the menus and make the necessary settings one after another.

- **1** Press **POWER** to turn on the TV.
- 2 The language screen appears, and then press **ENTER**.

Press ◀/► to select "Home" or "Store", and then press ENTER. Home:

• "Standard" will be the default value for the "Picture mode" setting.

Store:

- "Dynamic" will be the default value for the "Picture mode" setting. If the "Picture mode" is changed, the TV will automatically switch back to "Dynamic" when there is no further change to TV setting for 30 minutes.
- The confirmation screen appears only when selecting "Store".

Press ◀/► to select "Yes" or "No".

- To change the Store mode to Home mode, please refer to page 11 to reset the unit.
- Auto installation will be executed.
- You do not need to do anything during the auto search.

Selecting a preset Picture mode

"Picture mode" gives you several viewing options to choose from to best match the system environment, which can vary due to factors like room-brightness, type of programme watched or the type of image input from external equipment.

 - You can also switch the mode in the "Picture mode" menu on the "Picture" menu screen.

Selected item	Description
Dynamic	For a clear-cut image emphasising high contrast for sports viewing.
Standard	For a highly defined image in a normally bright room.
Mild	For a softer picture brightness.
Personal	Allows the user to customise settings as desired. You can set the mode for each input source.

• You can select a different Picture mode item for each input mode. (For example, select Standard for TV input and Dynamic for AV input.)



Auto volume

Different sound sources, fairly often do not have the same volume level, for example the changing from movie to the advertisements. Auto volume solves this problem and equalises the volume levels. (On, Off)

Allows you to select what controls the audio output.

Sleep timer

- Select "Off" to cancel the Sleep timer.
- You can also select "Sleep timer" by pressing SLEEP.

No operation off

You can set the TV to automatically power off when no TV operation is performed for more than 3 hours. (30 min., 3 hours, Disable)

• Five minutes before the power shuts down, the remaining time displays every minute.

No signal off

You can set the TV to automatically power off in about 15 minutes after the TV goes into a state of receiving no programme signals. (Enable, Disable)

• Five minutes before the power shuts down, the remaining time displays every minute.

 If the input source is PC, the TV will automatically power off in about 5 minutes after the TV goes into a state of receiving no signal.

 When a TV programme finishes, and the TV receives signal input, this function may not operate.

Lock menu



Lock system

You can block the viewing of any selected channel. (On, Off)

Password must be set first to allow "Lock system" to function.

- **1** Press **MENU** and the MENU screen displays.
- 2 Press **∢**/**▶** to select "இ" (Lock).
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select "Lock system", and then press ENTER.
- 4 If you have already set the password, enter it here.

Set password

Allows you to use a password to protect certain settings from being accidentally changed.

- Enter the old 4-digit number as a password using 0 9, and then enter the new 4-digit number as a password.

Block programme

Allows you to prevent unauthorized user such a child from watching unsuitable programmes.

- **1** Repeat steps 1 and 2 in **Lock system**.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to select "Block programme", and then press ENTER.

The "Block programme" screen will appear.

3 Press \blacktriangle/V to select the programme you want to lock, and then press **G**.

Setup menu



Language

Select from among 10 languages: English, Simplified Chinese, Arabic, French, Portuguese, Russian, Persian, Thai, Vietnamese and Indonesian.

Text language

Select from among 5 kinds of language: West europe, East europe, Cyrillic, Arabic, Farsi.

NOTE

• Teletext can display only when it is sent by a network. Not used to convert between languages.

Wide mode

You can manually select the size of a picture appeared on your screen.

Selectable picture size varies with the type of signal received.

Press $\blacktriangle/ {\bf V}$ while the Wide mode menu displays on the screen.

 As you toggle down the options, each mode is immediately reflected on the TV.





Adjusting the PC image automatically

Auto adjust

This function enables the screen to be automatically adjusted to its best possible condition when the analogue terminals of the TV and PC are connected with a commercially available RGB cable, etc.

NOTE

 Auto adjust is likely to succeed when an input PC image has wide vertical stripes (e.g. pattern with high contrast stripes, or cross-hatched).

It may fail when an input PC image is solid (low contrast).

Adjusting the PC image manually

Ordinarily you can easily adjust the picture as necessary to change image position using Auto adjust. In some cases, however, manual adjustment is needed to optimise the image.

H-offset	Centres the image by moving it to the left or right.
V-offset	Centres the image by moving it up or down.
Size	Adjusts the image size to shrink or expand.

Teletext function

What is Teletext?

Teletext broadcasts pages of information and entertainment to specially equipped television sets. News, weather reports, sports information, stock exchange prices and programme previews are among the many services available.

Turning on and off Teletext

- 1 Select a TV channel or external input source providing the Teletext programme.
- 2 Press (a) to display the Teletext.



Troubleshooting

The problems described below are not always caused by malfunctions. Check the TV again before having the TV serviced.

Picture is cut off.	Are screen mode adjustments such as picture size made correctly? (See pages 7, 11.)	
• Strange colour, light colour, or dark, or colour misalignment.	 Adjust the picture tone. (See page 8.) Is the room too bright? The picture may look dark in a room that is too bright. Check the "Colour system" setting. (See page 8.) 	
Power is suddenly turned off.	 The unit's internal temperature has increased. Remove any objects blocking the vent or clean. Is the "Sleep timer" set? (See page 9.)

• When the unit is used in a low temperature space (e.g. room, office), the picture may leave trails or appear slightly

• Do not leave the unit in a hot or cold location. Also, do not leave the unit in a location exposed to direct sunlight or near

a heater, as this may cause the cabinet to deform and the LCD panel to malfunction. Storage temperature: -20° C to $+60^{\circ}$ C.

Clearing the password
