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Dear SHARP customer

Thank you for your purchase of the SHARP LCD colour TV product. To ensure safety and many years of trouble-free operation of your product, please read the Important Safety Precautions carefully before using this product.

Important Safety Precautions

- Stand base must be attached to prevent the TV set from falling down and cause injuries.
- Cleaning Unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet before cleaning the product. Use a soft damp cloth to clean the product. Do not use liquid cleaners, aerosol cleaners or chemical cloth to clean it, as such materials may damage the product.
- Water and moisture Do not use the product near water, such as bathtub, washbasin, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool and in a wet basement.
- Do not place vases or any other water-filled containers on this product. The water may spill onto the product causing fire or electric shock.
- Stand Do not place the product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod or table. Doing so can cause the product to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. Use only a cart, stand, tripod, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the product. When mounting the product on a wall, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. Use only the mounting hardware recommended by the manufacturer.
- When relocating the product placed on a cart, it must be moved with utmost care. Sudden stops, excessive force and uneven floor surface can cause the product to fall from the cart.

Precautions when transporting the TV

When transporting the TV, never carry it by holding or otherwise putting pressure onto the display. Be sure to always carry the TV by two people holding it with two hands — one hand on each side of the TV.

- Do not display a still picture for a long time, as this could cause an afterimage to remain.
- Install the product on the place where the AC cord can be unplugged easily from the AC outlet, or from the AC INPUT terminal on the rear of the product.

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Attaching the stand

- Before attaching (or detaching) the stand, unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet.
- Before performing work spread cushioning over the base area to lay the TV on. This will prevent it from being damaged.
- 1 Confirm the screws supplied with the TV.

- 2 Fix the supporting post into the holes on the rear of the TV. (1) Insert and tighten the four screws into the holes. (2)
- 3 Insert the stand base to the stand post on the bottom of the TV. (3)
- 4 Insert and tighten the screws into the holes on the rear of the TV. (④)

• To detach the stand, perform the steps in reverse order.

• Do not attach or detach the stand without holding it. Doing so can cause the stand to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the stand.

Connect antenna cable to the antenna terminal



If your outdoor antenna uses a 75-ohm coaxial cable with a standard DIN45325 plug (IEC 169-2), plug it into the antenna jack at the rear of the set.

If your outdoor antenna uses a 300-ohm twinlead flat feeder, connect a 300-ohm to 75-ohm impedance converter and plug it into the antenna iack at the rear of the set.

• TO PREVENT RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK. DO NOT TOUCH UN-INSULATED PARTS OF ANY CABLES WITH THE AC CORD CONNECTED.



Place the TV close to the AC outlet, and keep the power plug within reach.

Connecting external devices

You can connect many types of external equipment to your TV, like a VCR, game console, camcorder, DVD player, Digital TV STB (Set Top Box) and PC. To view external source images, select the input source from **INPUT** on the remote control unit or **INPUT** on the TV.

- To protect all equipment, always turn off the TV before connecting to a VCR, game console, camcorder, DVD player, Digital TV STB (Set Top Box), PC or other external equipment.

Turning the TV on/off

Minor power is consumed when the unit is in standby mode.

Standby mode

- To standby mode If the TV is switched on, you can switch it to standby by pressing **POWER** on the remote control.
- Switching on from standby From standby, press **POWER** on the remote control.

Initial auto installation

When the TV powers on for the first time after purchase, the initial auto installation wizard appears. Follow the menus and make the necessary settings one after another.

- Press **POWER** on the TV.
 The initial auto installation wizard appears.
- Press ▲/▼/◀/► to select the desired language, and then press ENTER.
- 3 Press
 to select "HOME" or "STORE", and then press ENTER.
 Press ▲/▼ to select the desired sound system, and then press ENTER.
 - Auto installation will be executed.

- HOME mode: Settings are optimised for normal home viewing and energy efficiency.
- STORE mode: Settings are designed for maximum impact in retail store displays.

 If "Lock" is set to "On" for a channel, "Child lock has been activated" is displayed when you select the channel, and the image and sound of the channel is blocked.
- When pressing **ENTER** while "Child lock has been activated" is displayed, password input menu will be displayed. Inputting the correct password lifts the child lock temporarily until the power is turned off.

Sort

Channel position can be sorted freely.

You can set the TV to automatically power off when no TV operation is performed for more than 3 hours. (30 min., 3 hr., Disable)

Allows you to use a password to protect certain settings from being accidentally changed.

Volume display when headphones are plugged in



 OUTPUT terminal is also used for headphones. Reduce the volume before using headphones. Overwhelming sound may damage your hearing.

Auto Volume

Different sound sources, fairly often do not have the same volume level, for example the changing from movie to the advertisements. Auto Volume solves this problem and equalises the volume levels. (On, Off)

Audio Only

When listening to music from a music programme, you can set the display off and enjoy audio only.

This function is conveniently used when, for instance, going to bed while watching TV. (Off, 0 hr. 30 min.,, 2hr. 30 min.)

This function is to set a reminder for an activity. Press \blacktriangle/ ∇ or **ENTER** to set.

NOTE

- If you turn off the TV, the counter will be reset.
- The \underline{X} (Reminder) function does not work in USB mode.

- Some picture sizes may not be displayable depending on the input signal.

Wide mode

You can select different picture sizes that account for the kind of each pictures manually.

Appendix

Troubleshooting

The problems described below are not always caused by malfunctions. Check the TV again before having the TV serviced.

Problem	Possible Solution
• No power.	 Check if you pressed POWER on the remote control unit. (See page 6.) If the indicator on the TV lights up red, press POWER. Is the AC cord disconnected? Has the power been turned on? (See page 6.)
Unit cannot be operated.	 External influences such as lightning, static electricity, etc., may cause improper operation. In this case, operate the unit after first turning the power off the TV or unplugging the AC cord and re-plugging it in after 1 or 2 minutes.
Remote control unit does not operate.	 Are batteries inserted with polarity (+, -) aligned? (See page 5.) Are batteries worn out? (Replace with new batteries.) Are you using it under strong or fluorescent lighting? Is a fluorescent light shining on the remote control sensor?
Picture is cut off.	• Are screen mode adjustments such as picture size made correctly? (See page 12.)
Strange colour, light colour, or dark, or colour misalignment.	 Adjust the picture tone. (See page 9.) Is the room too bright? The picture may look dark in a room that is too bright. Check the colour system setting. (See pages 8, 11.) Check the "HDMI Auto View" setting. (See page 10.)
Power is suddenly turned off.	 The unit's internal temperature has increased. Remove any objects blocking the vent or clean. Check the "ECO" setting. (See page 10.) Is the sleep timer set? (See page 5.)
No picture.	 Is the connection to external equipment correct? (See page 4.) Is the picture adjustments correct? (See page 9.) Is the antenna connected properly? (See page 3.) Is "On" selected in "Audio Only"? (See page 11.)
No sound.	Is the volume too low? (See page 5.)
The TV sometimes makes a cracking sound.	 This is not a malfunction. This happens when the cabinet slightly expands and contracts according to changes in temperature. This does not affect the TV's performance.

Cautions regarding use in high and low temperature environments

• When the unit is used in a low temperature space (e.g. room, office), the picture may leave trails or appear slightly delayed. This is not a malfunction, and the unit will recover when the temperature returns to normal.

 Do not leave the unit in a hot or cold location. Also, do not leave the unit in a location exposed to direct sunlight or near a heater, as this may cause the cabinet to deform and the LCD panel to malfunction.
 Storage temperature: -20°C to +60°C.

- 2 The password input screen displays.
- **3** If you enter "3001" using **0 9**, the "Child Lock" setting menu will be displayed.
